### Sycamore

Our school uses an online database and communication system called **Sycamore**. Currently, we channel virtually all of our communication with parents through Sycamore. Learning Reports are sent home via the students.

**All JKCS parents must attend the Term 1 Learning Conferences.** These conferences are scheduled during the afternoon and evening. It is crucial that our teachers and parents develop a cohesive and open line of communication.

**Term 2 Learning Conferences are optional.** Parents may choose to schedule a conference. Teachers may also request to meet with the parents to discuss the next steps for a child's learning. Additional conferences may be arranged directly with the teacher.

We encourage teachers to contact parents on a regular basis. We also encourage parents to contact the school whenever they have concerns to share with their child's teacher. Please leave a message and the teacher will contact you as soon as possible.

We expect that all parents abide by the spirit of Matthew 18 in which we communicate directly with each other. Should attempts to rectify a situation prove to be difficult and another person may be helpful to provide structure and leadership, we encourage both parties to reach out to someone from our staff leadership team.

## DISCIPLINE

We are aware that even though various policies and procedures may be put into place to prevent inappropriate behaviour, there will be those who will need support in order to help them behave in a more appropriate manner. Therefore, the following guidelines spell out more clearly the consequences of certain actions.

Our goal is to provide a school environment in which students are empowered to reflect thoughtfully when the expected behavior has been lacking, to consider the consequences of this behavior on others, to seek to reconcile with those negatively affected, and to learn how to improve behavior in similar situations in the future.

Our staff commits to employing the practices that “help students learn from their mistakes and reconcile and resolve problems with others.” (excerpt from *Restorative Practices Research Document 3*.) As such, we subscribe to an approach that works with students, a practice that is authoritative, re-integrative, collaborative and cooperative (excerpt from Ted Wachel, 1999.)

When an incident occurs, students may be asked to reflect upon the following questions using the discipline form located in the office. This form may or may be sent home for parents to review, sign, and return to school.

1. What happened?
2. How did you act?
3. Who was affected?
4. How were they affected?
5. What needs to happen to make things right?
6. How will you behave differently if this situation happens again?

This process may be supplemented with additional conversations and/or parent involvement. Teachers need to assess each incident on its own merit and decide whether to deal with the issue themselves and consider whether parents need to be involved.

Should the teacher exhaust all avenues to move the situation forward positively, they can contact the administration for their involvement. The administration is also available at all times for consultation. It is possible that in-school or home suspensions may occur should the situation warrant a student be removed from his classroom community.

## **SPECIAL EVENTS**

### **Chapel**

Chapel is held on Monday mornings and explores topics related to the school's annual theme. During Chapel, we praise the Lord and build community among the student body.

We host chapels for students in Grades 1-6 and for students in Grades 7 and 8. Our Director of Student Life and Leadership is in charge of developing our school theme through our chapels, paying attention to the appropriate content and level of understanding for all involved.

### **Special Emphasis**

Throughout the year, there are certain events which receive special emphasis. Most of these events are tied to school curriculum or a special community event. These include Grand Friends Day, Celebration of Learning, and our Christmas Program. In advance of these special activities, families will receive full details from the classroom teachers and/or the bi-weekly school newsletter, including information on how to participate.

### **Homeroom**

Each student in grade K-8 is assigned to a homeroom. Specialized subjects, such as art, technology, library, music, and physical education will either require the teacher to rotate into the homeroom, or the students to move to the area assigned for the subject.

### **Co-curricular Programmes**

JKCS recognizes the value of experiences that take place outside of the homeroom classroom. The school offers a wide array of exceptional co-curricular programmes, including. Please see the [LEARNING](#) section of our website for a full list of co-curricular and extracurricular events.

### **Fundraising Opportunities**

## **SCHOOL PROCEDURES**

### **Absence Reporting**

If a student will be absent for the day, the parent must phone or email the office by 9:00 am.

For a short-term absence due to a vacation, the parent is asked to submit a [Student Vacation form](#) to the office. This form is located on the “Parents” section of the school website, under “[Downloadable Forms](#).” It is the parent's responsibility to contact the teacher(s) so additional work may be assigned to allow the student to stay current with the rest of the class.

### **Accidents and/or Incidents**

Major accidents and/or incidents that take place at the school will be documented and the family or families involved will be notified by the office or leadership staff. It is important to us that you as parents are aware.

### **Allergies (Food and Scent)**

JKCS is a nut-free and scent-free school. This protects our students and staff who have sensitivities and allergies.

Please do not bring food that contains nuts or may have come into contact with nuts into our school. This includes shareable foods from Tim Horton's and any bakery products. (For example, muffins, donuts, TimBits, etc.)

If you will be volunteering inside the school, please refrain from wearing perfume, cologne, or strong scents.

Thank you for keeping our students and staff safe!

## **Appointments (Medical, Dental)**

We realize that it is not always possible to schedule these appointments after school or on non-school days. However, parents should be aware that students will miss part of the learning process that can never be fully replicated later.

We thank you in advance for keeping disruptions to the learning process to a minimum.

## **Arriving Late**

**All students should be seated in their homeroom classroom by 8:35 am.** Students arriving late must report to the Welcome Desk and obtain a late slip. This slip will allow them to enter their homeroom.

## **Awards and Special Recognition**

Our awards program acknowledges student participation in activities that are over and above the normal curriculum. JKCS offers a number of extracurricular activities for which the students may receive an award.

Opportunities to participate in extracurricular activities vary from grade to grade, as well as from year to year. A [list of extracurricular activities](#) is posted in the [Learning](#) section of our website.

## **Before & After School Care (BASC)**

From 7:00 am until 8:15 am, and from 3:35 pm until 6:00 pm, JKCS provides Before and After School Care (BASC) for a modest fee.

Students in the BASC program are supervised by caring and qualified JKCS staff. Students are cared for in a nurturing, creative, and fun environment.

JKCS families can register for BASC on an ongoing basis, or on an as-needed basis. Online registration for BASC, as well as policies and fees, are located on the [PARENTS](#) section of the website.

## **Birthday Invitations and Celebrations**

**It is the school's policy that birthday invitations are ONLY distributed at school if ALL classmates are invited.** This decreases the hurt felt by those who are not invited to the party. Family emails are available in [SYCAMORE](#).

As you plan birthday parties and/or social gatherings, we thank you in advance for:

1. Inviting EITHER a small minority OR all students in the class.
2. Only handing out invitations to classmates at school when ALL are invited.
3. Erring on the side of inclusion rather than exclusion.

JKCS is a Healthy Eating School, which means we cannot have cupcakes, Tim Hortons, or other sugary treats brought in for birthdays or other special occasions. Exceptions will be made for special treats for Christmas and Valentine's Day classroom celebrations. Teachers will communicate when special treats may be brought in.

### **Closing for Inclement Weather**

If the school closes due to inclement weather, JKCS families are notified through our automatic voice messaging system and via text. School closures will also be announced on the JKCS website and on our social media (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter).

### **Class Trips**

Typically, classrooms take two or three trips outside of the school each year. On most occasions, busing will be used to transport our students. Some trips involve walking to learning opportunities in the Clearview neighbourhood. Be sure to stay connected via the Classroom Connection that is maintained by the classroom teachers. Parents are encouraged to join their child's class on these outings.

Two class trips have become traditions for students in senior grades:

#### **Grade 8 Leadership Retreat**

This three-day, two-night trip to [Ontario Pioneer Camp](#) takes place at the beginning of each school year. Pioneer is a Christian youth camp located in Port Sydney, Ontario (north of Bracebridge). The costs for this trip are included in tuition costs.

#### **Grade 7 and 8 Trip (May)**

Typically, this tour alternates between Quebec City and the Ottawa region. This exciting trip is connected to the curriculum and students experience history, French, art, science, civics, and geography. The costs for this trip are included in tuition costs.

### **Criminal Record/Police Checks/Child Welfare**

All employees and all volunteers who have ANY contact with students **must** provide the school with a criminal record check and vulnerable sector screening obtained through the police department of the municipality in which they live. In addition, all adults must be trained in child welfare procedures by reading the school's [Child Welfare Policy and Procedures Manual](#). This training requires an annual follow-up video to be watched.

## **Dishonesty (Academic)**

Cheating and plagiarism are strictly prohibited. Cheating during a test or on an assignment will normally result in a mark of zero. Students who use the material of others, including internet sources, without appropriate acknowledgements are plagiarizing and will normally receive a mark of zero.

## **Exams - Grades 7 & 8**

In Term 2, grade 7 and 8 students will write a Language Arts exam. At the end of Term 3, students in grades 7 and 8 will write Math exams, and grade 8 students will also write exams in French, and Science. Our graduates consistently tell us that our exam process helped prepare them well for high school.

## **Electronic Devices and Technology (Cell Phones, MP3 players, iPads, etc.)**

Cell phones are not to be used in the school. If a student needs to be contacted, or if a parent needs to be contacted, school phones are available upon request. It is our practice for the senior homeroom teachers to collect phones at the beginning of the day and safely store them in a locked cupboard. The phones will be returned to the students at the end of the day before the students go home. If a student uses a cell phone inappropriately, it will be confiscated by the teacher and returned at the end of the day. Should any student require further support, the administration will be pleased to help.

Students in Grades 5-8 are required to bring their own Chromebooks to school each day. It must be a Chromebook, and may be any size of Chromebook. It cannot be a laptop with Chrome or a MacBook. Families will purchase and care for their own Chromebook to use in the school and at home. Students are responsible for the care and use of their Chromebooks. Teachers and parents partner to help teach students how to handle this responsibility and how to use their devices to help ignite wonder for God, neighbour, and creation.

## **Graduation**

Grade 8 graduation ceremony takes place in the last week prior to the end of the school year. The graduation ceremony is open to all parents, grandparents and siblings of the graduates. During the ceremony, [JKCS Graduation Awards](#) will be distributed.

Following the ceremony, a dinner for graduates and their parents only is provided at a location determined by the graduation committee. Parents pay a fee toward the dinner and ceremony costs.

## Homework Guidelines

Teachers give homework as a planned part of the educational process. It is designed to enhance student learning and assist in the development of life-long learning skills, such as self-discipline, task and time management, prioritization, responsibility, independence, initiative, and problem solving. Studies have shown that students who set aside time at home for studying, reading, and doing school work experience greater achievement than those who do not.

Homework is generally divided into 4 types:

1. **completion** of classroom work
2. **practice** and review of concepts
3. **preparation** for future learning
4. **creative extension** of classroom learning (projects and independent study assignments)

Students should expect to spend an average of 10 minutes per grade per night doing homework. For example, a grade 3 student would have up to 30 minutes of homework per night. Homeroom teachers monitor the flow of assignments, and ample notice with respect to due dates is given for large assignments/projects. Students are encouraged to be self-advocates when flexibility is required to complete work.

## Out of Bounds

Students are not allowed outside of the fence that surrounds the perimeter of the school unless they have received special permission from a teacher.

## Parking

Please park your car in the designated parking area if you plan on entering the school. Do not leave your vehicle parked in the area designated for bus traffic or for the express flow of car traffic. Thank you for ensuring that our parking lot is safe for all vehicles.
